



What is New in the New WVU eCampus?

Blogs	A separate communication tool available in Content Area.
Course menu easily customized	Add content areas, module pages, tool links, web links, etc. Add sub headers and dividers. Drag and drop reordering makes it easier to organize content.
Course to Course Navigation	Easily switch to same tool or content area in a different section when enrolled in multiple sections in eCampus (button to the right of the Home button).
Drag & Drop feature	Easy to rearrange items on a page. Drag files from a local computer while uploading files to content collection.
Early Warning System	Rule-driven communication tool to send email notifications to students when the rule criteria are met. Create rules in the Evaluation > Early Warning System. Module can be found in the Notifications Dashboard tab.
Email / Send Email	Message sent to WVU MIX email address; reply sent will go to MIX email address (correspondence will be external to course)
Global Navigation Panel	Modify settings, switch to different courses, and view items such as recent posts, updates, grades, and calendar.
Grade Center “Needs Grading”	“Needs grading” view – shows the instructor submitted items in the course that need grading.
Journals	A separate tool now, with enhanced features.
Lesson Plan	Lesson plans enable Instructors and Course Builders to create a structured unit plan.
Mashups	This tool makes it easy to add a voice recording or embed a link to a SlideShare presentation, a YouTube video, or a Flickr photo on a course content page.
Notifications Dashboard	Modules designed to provide information about what is happening and what will happen in a course: Needs Attention, Alerts, What’s New, To Do (students only).
Performance Dashboard	Review students’ activity within the course.
360° view	Provides all the information stored about any piece of content in the Content Collection (metadata, links to item).
Smart Views	Allows grading by categories in one view
Wikis	Create an area internal to the course that allows students to collaborate, create, and edit web-based content.

Build, Teach, Student View tabs	Edit Mode ON for building or modifying content Edit Mode OFF is equivalent to Teach tab <i>WVU has added a third-party Student View as an extension to Learn.</i>
Chat with whiteboard	Collaboration: Virtual Classroom
Chat without whiteboard	Collaboration: Chat Session
Course Tools	Course Menu
Designer and Instructor Tools	Course Management
Discussions - Topic - Message - Reply	Discussion Board – Forum – Thread – Reply
e-packs	Course Cartridges
File Manager	Content Collection
Goals	Not available as a stand-alone tool; you can specify your learning objectives in your course content and syllabus.

Media Library	Glossary (<i>only type of collection</i>)

Search	not available as a course menu tool
Selective Release	Adaptive Release
Student: My Grades	Tools > My Grades <i>and</i> Global Navigation: My Grades <i>and</i> My WVU eCampus: Report Card module
Syllabus	Not a stand-alone tool. Instead, you add a syllabus to a content page or learning module from the Build Content drop-down list (choice of Syllabus builder or upload file).
Tracking	Evaluation > Course Reports
Web Links	Not a stand-alone tool. You can add individual web links to the Course Menu and can easily add links to content pages.
Who's Online	Not available. Alternatives: you can use Chat, Virtual Classroom, or Wimba Classroom to conduct online conversations with students.



Click on **Assessments** to add a quiz, survey, or assignment to a content area or learning module

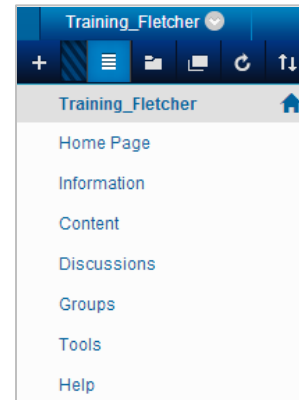
Click on **Tools** to add a link to a tool such as announcements, calendar, discussion board, chat room, iclicker registration, etc..

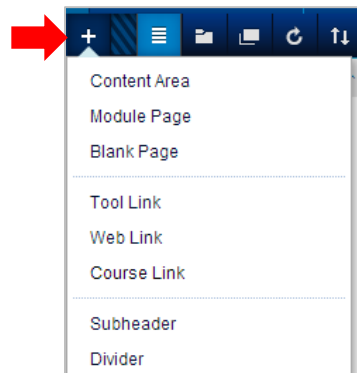

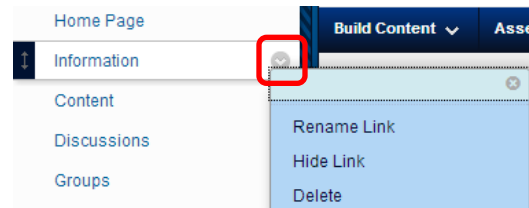


Course Menu: List View

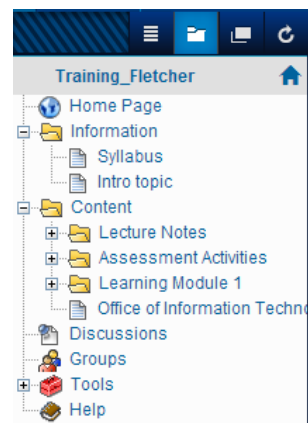


Click on + to add items (while in List View)
