DO I NEED TO PURCHASE A COMPUTER?

Having a personal computer is convenient, but before you buy a new one, check with your specific college to see if your program has computer and software requirements. it.wvu.edu/computer

WINDOWS OR MAC?

WVU supports both! Unless your major has specific computer requirements, we recommend using what you're comfortable with. You can even download Windows 11 for free and install it on your Mac using Apple's Boot Camp utility. Find instructions at support.apple.com/boot-camp.

DOES WVU SELL COMPUTERS?

Generally, no. However, the Health Sciences Center requires students to buy a standardized laptop once they are accepted into certain programs. Until then, you can use University computer labs, libraries or a personal computer. it.wvu.edu/computer
